STATUTORY TASKS OF THE POLISH POLICE

Act of 6 April 1990 on the Police

- Protection of people's life and health and protection of property against lawless assaults which might cause damage to those goods.
- Protection of public safety and order, including ensuring peace in public places and in public means of transport, road traffic and on waters allocated for common use.



STATUTORY TASKS OF THE POLISH POLICE

- Initiation and organization of activities aimed at preventing crimes and petty offences and crime-related events, and cooperation with state authorities, local governments and social organizations in that regard.
- Detection of crimes and petty offences and prosecution of perpetrators thereof.

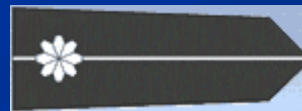

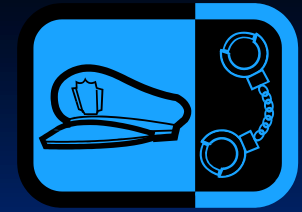

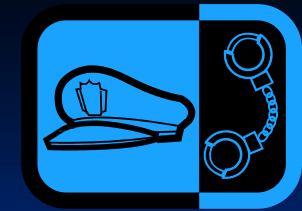

Important!

- Remember, there are also operational police officers. They do not wear uniforms, but you can always ask them to show you their police identity cards!
- Remember that police officers may ask you to show them your documents in order to establish your identity and they are entitled to do so.



Remember!

- In Poland, there is the Police emergency telephone number **112**!
- If you want to notify the Police of any issue, you should go to the nearest police station with your guardian or a person that speaks Polish.



Remember!

- If you do not know a person that speaks Polish, your deposition will be translated by a sworn translator.
- However, sometimes you have to wait for a sworn translator for a couple of hours on the police station.
- Be patient! You do not wait because police officers do not want to help you, but because some proceedings take time.
- Take your ID with you (your passport, student ID or other document with your photo).



Remember!

- You can report a crime on every police station. If the crime is committed in the region of another police station, documents prepared by the police officer will be sent to an appropriate police station.
- While reporting a crime, you should always have the address of your stay with you. Have your address written on a piece of paper in order not to forget it. It is very important so that the Police could contact you!!!!

Important!

- In Poland, you are obliged to follow the regulations of the Polish penal law!
- Your rights and obligations ensue from the Polish law.
- You are obliged to follow the Polish law and you can react when somebody violates the law. You may report a crime and help victims – but always remember about your own safety!



Remember!!!

- In Poland it is forbidden to drink alcohol in public places, e.g. on the benches in parks, stairways, bus stops, playgrounds, etc. !
- Be aware that alcohol in Poland is much stronger so be careful!



Remember!

- In Poland, it is forbidden to drive a car or ride a bike after drinking alcohol. It is punishable!



Important!

- Be aware that on the basis of your behaviour a police officer may conclude whether or not you have been driving after drinking alcohol and may check alcohol concentration by breathalyzer test.



Remember!

- In Poland, any contact with drugs, designer drugs and other psychoactive substances is forbidden!
- In Poland, each person that possesses, sells, gives for free, grows or transports drugs through borders is subject to penalty!





Important!

- In Poland it is not forbidden 'to have a good time', but remember that loud behaviour, especially after 10 p.m. is considered to be breach of the peace and is punishable!
- Behave in public places – do not litter, do not swear, do not walk on grass and cross the street on the crossings!

Municipal Police Department in Lublin suggests:

- Take care of your safety at home and on the street.
- When you leave home, lock the door and do not leave valuable things unattended.



Municipal Police Department in Lublin suggests:

- On the street and on the bus, keep your belongings in sight.
- Try not to demonstrate your valuable things (mobile phone, jewellery, wallet)!
