

WASTE MANAGEMENT IN POLAND:

We have four colours of containers:

- Blue for **PAPER**
- Green for **GLASS**
- Yellow for **METALS AND PLASTIC MATERIALS**
- Brown for **BIODEGRADABLE WASTE**

Anything that you can't put in a bin of these four colour should go to the fifth one – for mixed waste.

PAPER	GLASS
<p>paper bags and packages, cartons and paperboard, catalogs, leaflets, old magazines, notebooks, books, stationery (office paper), wrapping paper</p> <p>do not put in:</p> <p>greasy paper, pads, paper towels, used tissues, coated paper, milk or juice cartons, cement sacks</p>	<p>food and beverage bottles and jars, cosmetics packaging</p> <p>do not put in:</p> <p>porcelain, pottery, crystals, flower pots, light bulbs, window panes, table glassware, eye-wear or heat-proof glass, electronics, thermometers, prescription bottles, packaging of motor oil or solvent products</p>
METAL AND PLASTIC	BIO-WASTE
<p>plastic bags and bottles, food containers, cleaning supplies and cosmetics packaging, bottle tops and lids, milk and juice cartons, soda cans and tin cans, aluminium foil</p> <p>do not put in:</p> <p>hazardous waste such as expired medications, batteries, motor oil and its packaging, car parts, paint or varnish cans</p>	<p>food leftovers, fruits and vegetables, green waste (tree and shrub branches), grass, leaves, flowers</p> <p>do not put in:</p> <p>animal bones or excrement, ash, soil, stones or dust, particle board, treated wood</p>
